

P25 Using Problem-Based Learning to Systematically Develop an Action Plan

Problem-Based Learning (PBL) is a systematic process involving identification of a sample issue and development of steps to resolve that issue, and utilizing that process to further develop one's ability to identify, analyze, and resolve both concrete and abstract issues in general. This workshop will provide an overview of the PBL process, and discuss how one presenter successfully used PBL to create a faculty advisor development plan while attending the NACADA Summer Institute. Working in small groups, participants will be coached through the PBL process to develop their own action plan for an advising issue that they bring with them to the workshop.
