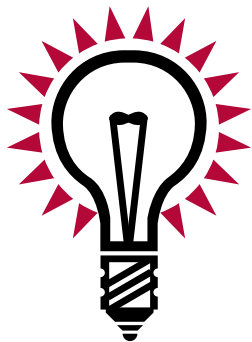

WHAT ARE commissions and interest groups?

Groups of NACADA members who share a similar interest or focus—for example, adult learners, assessment of advising, multicultural concerns, faculty advising, small colleges, advising military students and dependents, advising students with disabilities, technology, two-year colleges, distance education advising, study abroad advising, liberal arts advisors, advising high achieving students . . . and many more.

Commissions propose and facilitate activities, networking and resources to advance the professional development of members while focusing on a specific area. Interest Groups focus on specific issues or represent a particular interest of NACADA members, but have no formal governance role.

WHAT ROLE do commissions and interest groups play in NACADA?

Commissions and Interest Groups communicate the needs of their groups to Division Representatives, identify areas for professional development, network via list serves, and meet during the annual fall conference. Commissions also participate in the selection of presentations for the annual conference.

In short, Commissions and Interest Groups are an important part of the glue that holds NACADA together and offer members a variety of avenues to meet their professional needs and specific interests within the field of academic advising.

WHAT OPPORTUNITIES are available for getting involved?

There are PLENTY of ways to get involved in these groups of members —

- attend annual meetings at the fall NACADA conference
- organize informal gatherings at regional or annual conferences
- be a steering committee member
- serve as webmaster
- volunteer as a proposal reader
- serve on a task force or committee
- assist with activities at conferences
- raise concerns or post questions on the list serve
- contribute to a publication or write an article
- serve as chair of a commission or interest group
- and many others — ***you can be as involved as you can or want to be!***

WHAT COMMITMENT am I making, if I join a commission or interest group?

You're indicating an interest in connecting with others who share your concerns — that's it!

OK, I'm ready to sign up. NOW WHAT?

You can join up to four commissions and/or interest groups—some members choose to affiliate with fewer. Indicate your choices on your membership form or renewal, or e-mail NACADA at nacada@ksu.edu. You can change your affiliations at any time — although you should be aware that this may affect your eligibility for certain awards and elected positions.
