

Karen Boston is the Assistant Dean for Undergraduate Programs at the Sam M. Walton College of Business at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. As Assistant Dean, Boston is directly responsible for overseeing all programs related to approximately 3200 undergraduate business students including academic advising. Since 1998, she has coordinated and taught in the Freshmen Business Connections (FBC), first year experience program in the Walton College - an extension of the academic advising program. Boston co-authored the first year experience book, *Freshmen Business Connections* (2008). She has worked in the Walton College since 1996 including serving as Managing Director of Undergraduate Programs, Director of Academic Advising and as an Academic Advisor. Prior to her work in the Walton College, her experiences include the University of Arkansas' Office of Admissions and the University of Arkansas' Law School in the areas of Career Services and Continuing Legal Education and Alumni Relations and Development.

Boston has been a member of NACADA since 1996 and is on the NACADA National Conference Program Committee for San Antonio 2009 and the NACADA Professional Development Committee. She has presented numerous sessions at both national and regional NACADA conferences in the areas of advising assessment and first year experience programs and served as the NACADA Commission Chair for Advising Business Majors from 2003-2005. Boston is a member of NASPA and AACSB International (The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business). Boston has been a member of the University of Arkansas' Academic Advising Council (AAC) since its inception in 2003 including as Vice Chair (2003) and Chair (2004) and a member of the Advising Assessment Task Force since 2004 which has established an institutional wide assessment program for academic advising.

In 2007, she was recognized by the Northwest Arkansas Business Journal as “40 Under 40” – a selection of 40 leaders under the age of 40 in the State of Arkansas. She is a graduate of Leadership Arkansas and Leadership Fayetteville and is the 2009-2010 Chair for the Fayetteville Chamber of Commerce Leadership Committee and serves on the Fayetteville Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors. Although a native of Texas, Boston received her bachelor's, masters and doctorate from the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. She is an Adjunct Instructor in the College of Education and Health Professions and resides in Fayetteville with her husband, Jay, seven year-old son, Winston, and Boxer, Guinness.
