#### **Proposal Reviews**

## Division and Leadership Meetings at Annual Conference

We know some of you have questions about when you should arrive at the Annual Conference and what meetings you are being asked to attend. The Board of Directors has solicited feedback from Council, and others, and we anticipate having a final leadership meeting schedule in the next few weeks. If you want to reserve a room now, you may consider trying to be sure you are available for the afternoon of October 3<sup>rd</sup>, but we'll update you once we have final confirmation.

## Community Meetings at Annual Conference

Information regarding the time and location for Advising Community meetings at Annual Conference should be sent out in May and should be confirmed by early June. The Advising Community Chair is required to lead their Community meeting and will be notified of their scheduled meeting at the same time that presenters are notified of conference sessions. Chairs will work with EO staff to draft the abstract for the session for inclusion in the Annual Conference program. Training and support will be provided by the Division as we near Annual Conference regarding how to prepare and host your Community Meeting. Begin thinking of any tips and best practices you would like to share!

## Virtual Community Meetings Post-Annual Conference

The opportunity to host a Virtual Advising Community meeting following the Annual Conference will be available again this year. Although Community meetings in-person at Annual Conference are required of every AC, the post-conference virtual meetings are *optional*. Chairs may choose to host a virtual meeting to reach community members who may not have been able to attend the in-person meeting. The content and focus of this meeting should be a duplicate of what was shared at Annual Conference, but in a virtual format.

## **Bylaws Updates**

We are currently working to make one additional bylaw amendment request. Currently cluster representatives are appointed positions, and as such have been excluded from voting for the elected advising community division representative. Our goal in a proposed amendment is to make it so all appointed and elected leaders of our division (and others) are able to vote for leaders within their respective divisions.

#### Cluster Representative Applications are now open

Applications for 2023-25 Cluster Rep positions are now open and will be **due May 5**, **2023**. Outgoing and former ACD Chairs (or former CIGD Commission or Interest Group Chairs) are eligible to apply. An email will be sent to those that qualify. This is a vital and growing role for the Division so if you wish to mentor new Chairs, we would love to see your application!).

In case you are interested in knowing the responsibilities of a Cluster Representative, here are a few points. The Division holds monthly meetings via Zoom with the Division Representatives and the Cluster Representatives that form the Division's Steering Committee [Steering Committee Information]. We also hold a Steering Committee lunch or dinner at Annual Conference on the day of our Division Meeting. Throughout the year, we ask for participation in specific working groups to meet the annual Division goals, beyond working with the Advising Communities in your cluster.

### **Elected and Appointed Leaders**

Please consider reaching out to newly elected and appointed leaders in the Advising Community Division. Liz will work on facilitating an introduction via email between current and incoming leaders. New leaders will be added to the Division's listserv by the end of May. An email will be sent out shortly after on behalf of the Division with contact information. New leaders are not yet required to assume any Chair responsibilities until their term starts in October, but an invitation may be extended later this summer for leaders to attend any meetings or connect with the current Chair to create a seamless transition. Incoming leaders will be added to NACADA listservs June 1st.

## NACADA Leadership Engagement Program (N-LEP)

Incoming leaders will be added to the N-LEP course by the end of this month with an anticipated target completion date of August 30th. Cluster Reps, please encourage incoming leaders to complete the course and assist with any questions leaders may have as they move through the modules.

## Appointing Leaders for Vacant Advising Communities

We currently have a number of advising communities that will require the division leaders to appoint chairs, rather than elect chairs. Our goal is to always have elected leaders, but situations do arise that require us to appoint leaders. In appointing leaders, we strive to utilize a formal process that ensures a fair review of any eligible member who is interested and applies. We will be sending an e-mail to the official membership rosters of the advising communities that need an appointed chair. We will review self-nominations in the next month in order to make appointments in time for a smooth transition depending on the cycle for each advising community chair appointment. ### **Website Updates**

We believe that most website updates have been completed at this point. If there are urgent requests that have been previously submitted, and they are still not showing, please go ahead to check in on that specific request to bump it up. Liz will continue to make updates to the appointed steering committees for each Advising Community. Further, modules on the webpages are being updated to provide consistency between all Advising Communities pages.
