TRAX Light Rail (Green line):

TRAX costs \$2.50 one way. TRAX Light Rail from the airport runs every 15 minutes on weekdays, and every 20 minutes on weekends. It will take you next to the convention center and the heart of downtown Salt Lake. It takes about 20 minutes from the airport to downtown. Driving Directions - to the Salt Palace Convention Center

***All NACADA hotels are located near the Convention Center.**

From Salt Lake City International Airport:

1. Begin by heading west on North Terminal Drive toward Bangerter Hwy.
2. Merge onto I-80 E toward City Center/Ogden/Provo.
3. Keep right at the fork in the ramp.
4. Stay straight to go onto West 600 S/UT-269 E.
5. Turn left onto South West Temple/UT-270. Continue to follow South West Temple.
6. 200 South West Temple is on the left.

From South:

1. Take Interstate 15 North to 600 South Exit.
2. Go East on 600 South to West Temple.
3. Turn left, and head north on West Temple to the Salt Palace at 200 South West Temple.

From North:

1. Take Interstate 15 South to 400 South Exit.
2. Go East on 400 South to West Temple.
3. Turn left, and head north on West Temple to the Salt Palace at 200 South West Temple.

Weather in Salt Lake City

According to The Salt Lake Convention and Visitors Bureau, fall in Salt Lake is a time of transition. Nearby canyons are filled with vibrant colors as the trees prepare for winter, while temperatures remain warm enough for comfortable outdoor recreation. Evenings can be chilly and toward the end of fall, snow is typical in both mountains and valley. The Ski Salt Lake resorts have had enough snow to open as early as Halloween, with typical opening days in mid to late November.

TRAX & Bus:

Public transportation is available from the Salt Lake International Airport to downtown Salt Lake City, at a cost of \$2.50 for either TRAX, or a UTA bus. Near the Convention Center, the Free Fare Zone allows you to hop on and off TRAX and UTA buses for free. If you would like to explore other areas of Salt Lake, it only costs \$2.50 (Day pass for \$6.25) one way. Bike Rental:

Rentals can be found at various locations in downtown Salt Lake. Pay \$5 for one time only membership; it lasts for 24 hours plus usage fees for each check out. If you only check out for 30 minutes or less, there is no additional fee. Between 31-60 minutes, it will cost between \$2 and \$5 for each additional 30 minutes. You can check out a bike at the conference center, and drop it off at any bike station in downtown Salt Lake.



**Walking:**

Walking in Downtown Salt Lake can be fun! However, as you can see in this picture, streets in Salt Lake are wider and each block is longer than most cities in the US. Each block is 660 feet long, which is about three times longer than most city blocks in the US. Even if it looks like 3 blocks on the map, these long blocks make it feel like a 9 block walk compared to most cities.

Parking:

Paid parking is available around the Salt Palace Convention Center. You can use a credit card or coins to pay. Your first two hours of parking are free after 8 pm each week day, and all day on Saturdays (although after 2 hours on Saturdays meters must be fed). Free for Sundays. The Salt Palace Convention Center also offers covered parking garages with customer service and security staff available on site. All of the hotels provide parking. Check with your hotel to compare rates.

There are two ATM machines in the Convention Center, next to the Business Center and the Cyber Café.
