Introduction to Tables of Chapter 6

In this chapter, the response to six survey questions are examined in order to better understand the caseload of professional academic advisors. The first group of questions address the use of professional academic advisors, the extent that advising is mandatory for students, and if advisees are assigned to academic advisors. The second set of questions address the number of full-time professional academic advisors, the number of students that advisors were responsible for, and the number of students that advisors met with.

For the question about the use of professional academic advisors, respondents were asked to indicate whether *yes*, professional academic advisors advised undergraduate students, or *no* they did not. For the question that addressed the extent to which advising was mandatory each term for all students, respondents were asked to indicate *yes*, *no*, or that it was mandatory only *for some students*. For the question about assigned advisees, respondents were asked to indicate whether *yes*, full-time professional advisors have assigned advisees, or *no* they do not have assigned advisees.

For the questions about the number of full-time professional advisors, the number of undergraduate students that full-time professional advisors were responsible for in an academic term, and the number of undergraduate students that full-time professional advisors met with in advising sessions during an academic term, respondents were asked to write-in the number. Responses to these questions were also used to calculate the average number of undergraduate students that a professional advisor was responsible for during an academic term, and the average number of undergraduate students that a professional advisor met with in advising sessions during an academic term.

Sample sizes smaller than 50 respondents are marked with an * (e.g., n=30*) for tables that present the number and percentage of respondents who endorsed a particular answer. The purpose of the asterisk is to draw your attention to the relatively small sample size. For these groups, a change in the answer of one respondent would result in a change of more than 2%. Inferences involving these groups should be made *cautiously*.

Sample sizes smaller than 30 respondents are marked with an ** (e.g., n=26**) for tables that present the average, or median, amount reported by respondents; for example, the average number of full-time professional advisors employed at an institution. The purpose of the double asterisk is to draw your attention to the relatively small sample size. Inferences involving these groups should be made *cautiously*.
